WARNING ORDER 2018-2019-005

1. SITUATION:

- a. Name of Event/Operation: CACC Leadership Summer Encampment
- b. Date: 16 23 June 2018
- c. Start and End Times: 0500-2100 Daily
- d. Location: Camp San Luis Obispo (SLO)
- e. Brigades Participating: All Units in the California Cadet Corps.
- f. Participation Requirements: All cadets in good standing in their respective units in the CACC with parental and commandant permission may attend.
- g. Training Events Planned: Basic Encampment (BST), Non-Commissioned Officer Academy (NCOA) and Officer Candidate School (OCS).
- **2. MISSION:** The 10th Corps of the California Cadet Corps will conduct the Annual Leadership Encampment 16-23 June 2019 to develop leaders within the California Cadet Corps, let cadets experience leaderships roles and encourage them to become future leaders.

3. EXECUTION:

- **a.** Commander's Intent: A training-based event that provides cadets with the ability to learn specific skill sets, while overcoming various team building challenges as a unit thus forming camaraderie, and enhancing the quality of leadership they assume. These cadets will be introduced to new environments that allow them to interact as a corps, while remaining safe during the event, thus resulting in a building of character and gaining of specific advanced knowledge that will strengthen *Esprit de corps. Essayons!*
- **b.** Concept of Operations: The Leadership Summer Encampment will focus on 3 training units: BST (Bear, Sword, Torch), Non-Commissioned Officer Academy (NCOA) and, Officer Candidate School (OCS). Each unit will endeavor to increase the leadership and skills at the respective levels.
 - 1) <u>BST</u> This unit is for cadets who are currently a Recruit, a Cadet or a Cadet First Class and are interested in obtaining rank up to C/CPL by the end of the encampment. Includes a comprehensive experience of cadet training: drill & ceremonies, bivouac, orienteering, obstacle course, LRC, Alpine Tower, marksmanship, drill competition and more.
 - 2) Non Commissioned Officer Academy This unit is for cadets who are current or aspiring NCOs, CFC and above. This course will focus on small unit and direct line leadership knowledge and skills. These skills are paramount for successful leadership at the squad leader, platoon sergeant and first sergeant positions. Includes management of formations, PT, the obstacle course, LRC, leadership training, conducting inspections, bivouac, land navigation, marksmanship and more.
 - 3) Officer Candidate School This unit is for cadets who are at least a C/SSG, in grade 7-12 in the current school year and are interested in service as a cadet officer. Cadets may attain a commission as a C/2LT if they pass. Includes learning to lead large

- groups, teamwork, LRC, managing a staff, preparation for command, leadership skills and theories, and more.
- 4) <u>Leadership</u> Platoon and Company level positions and Staff Assistants/NCO positions are available. Provides practical experience in leading a unit, building esprit de corps, operational support, and performing time management. Applicants register through the registration system NLT 15 MAR selecting "Leadership" as their first choice. They will be contacted by 10th Corps Staff seeking further information, and will be informed of positions assigned (or not) by the end of March.

c. Goals:

- 1) Goal 1 is to create a safe, learning environment for cadets to grow as individuals and build bonds through camaraderie within both their respective units and as a corps.
- 2) Goal 2 is to develop and expand the knowledge of cadets in order to prepare them to be successful leaders at their units.

d. Objectives:

- 1) 90% of cadet will pass/complete 1 of the 3 given courses
- 2) No major injuries will occur during this event.
- 3) 100% of cadets will develop a sense of camaraderie within the California Cadet Corps
- **e. Cadet Leaders & Staff Assignments:** The cadet staff and leaders for this event will be the 10th Corps Staff with selected company and platoon level leadership.
- **f. Application Process:** Cadets will individually submit an application starting 8 February 2019. The application will be posted at https://cacadets.org/Events/SummerEncampment.

g. Cost:

- Early Bird Price: Applications completed by 15 March 2019
 \$75 for a single camp
 \$125 for both Leadership and Advanced Camp
- Regular Price: Application completed after 15 March 2019
 \$125 for a single camp
 \$200 for both Leadership and Advanced Camp
- 3) Fees will be paid either with credit card on the Cadet Store Website (www.cadetstore.org, link available on the Summer Encampment page, or a check sent to the LEAD Foundation. Email cadetstore@cacadets.org to coordinate sending a check)
- 4) Cadets with financial need may apply for a \$50 scholarship by emailing a request to personnel@cacadets.org. Scholarship requests are due by **15 MAR 2019**. Request must state the need, give parent and commandant contact information along with the cadet's rank, unit, and which camps/programs the cadet is signing up for.

h. Key Suspense Dates:

- 1) Application Portal Opens: 8 February 2019
- 2) Scholarship requests due: 15 March 2019
- 3) Leadership Applications due: 15 March 2019
- 4) Application Portal Closes: 14 April 2019
 - i. Any applications completed after the close date will be accepted only if there are vacancies.

- **i.** Uniforms: Cadets are to bring their Class C, Class B, and PT uniforms, Cadets are to report in Class C. Class B will be worn on graduation day. Schools that have not been issued Class B or Class C uniforms should contact logistics@cacadets.org. to coordinate getting a uniform for participants.
- **j.** Advanced Party (ADVON): Cadets who are assigned to leadership roles ie. Battalion Commanders, Command Sergeants Major, etc. will arrive to Camp San Luis Obispo with the Advanced Party (ADVON) on 13 June 2019. These cadets will receive additional training and prepare for the main body arrival. The ADVON leadership cadets will be in communication with the 10th Corps staff via email.

4. SUSTAINMENT:

- a. Meals: All meals throughout the event will be provided by the CSLO Dining Facility (DFAC). The DFAC is able to accommodate dietary restrictions.
- b. Transportation: Transportation for this event will be provided by the HQCACC. Each brigade will have a designated pick up/drop off location for their cadets. Parents are responsible for getting their cadet to and from the pick/drop off locations. Times, dates and locations to be announced.
- c. Billeting: Billeting will be provided for all cadets throughout the duration of the Leadership Summer Camp, either in barracks or tents.

5. COMMAND AND CONTROL:

- a. Cadet Commander for this event will be the 10th Corps Commander, C/COL Friedle.
- b. Cadet Command Sergeant Major for this event will be the 10th Corps Command Sergeant Major, C/CSM Thorpe.
 - c. Corps Staff Advisor: LTC Baxter.
- d. All unit Commandants and individual unit commanders are responsible for the conduct and safety of their cadets.
 - e. Questions may be addressed to the 10th Corps Cadet Staff through normal channels.
